



FOREWARD

The Central Statistical Agency organize the statistical activities of the country in an effective and integrated manner to ensure the collection, compilation, analysis and supply of timely and accurate statistical data that are required for planning and monitoring social and economic development programs, research and control, policy formulation and administration purposes.

Among its objectives the CSA provides technical guidance and assistance to government agencies and institutions in their endeavor to establish administrative recording, registration and reporting systems; and build the capacity required for providing directives and consultations in development of administrative records and registration systems.

It lay down the system for the collection, compilation, classification and flow of statistical data; determine the type and particulars of statistical data to be collected and the period of collection; and monitor the execution; maintain internationally accepted standards with respect to the statistical data collected in the country in order to make them comparable to data produced by other countries, international organizations and the United Nations;

The CSA conducts various surveys in the socio-economic, demographic, agricultural and labour force areas and these generate a wealth of data and information. In addition, the CSA conducts Censuses of Population and Housing, Agricultural census and the Censuses of Business Establishments.

There are several line Ministries, Agencies and Institutions that collect, process and analyze data and information. Thus there is a necessity to harmonize the naming and coding used by the different agencies collecting data. This process allows data to be compared and aggregated where necessary. This will ensure uniformity in data collection, processing, analysis and dissemination of results and information countrywide. At the centre of this effort is the adoption of a uniform set of naming and coding to be used by all data producers such that comparability between the different sets of data can be easily achieved.

Thus the CSA in collaboration with other key data producers and other stakeholders developed this document of Statistical naming and coding as part of its effort to initiate and ensure coordination and harmonization between data producers and users.
